A student is considered on-track to graduate at the end of freshman year if they have:


- Completed 5 course credits and







of 2015 high school graduates from Social Justice who immediately enrolled in college completed a degree or credential by spring of 2021.


What credentials did 2015 Social Justice graduates complete and how did college completion at Social Justice compare to completion across CPS?
