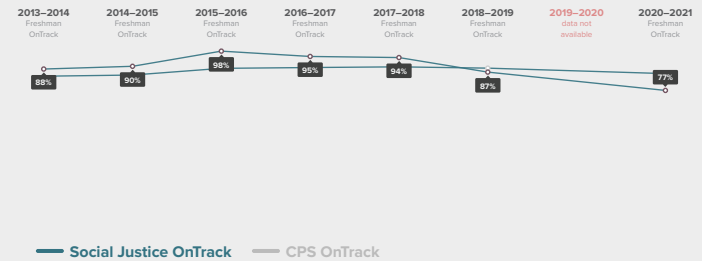
Freshman OnTrack

A student is considered on-track to graduate at the end of freshman year if they have:

- Completed **5** course credits and
- Failed no more than **1** semester of a core course in their first year of high school



High School Graduation

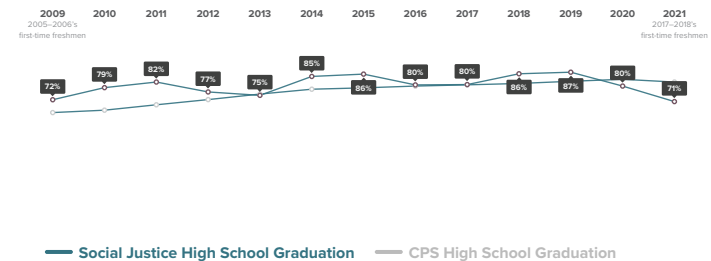


of 2017–2018 first-time freshmen at Social Justice graduated high school by spring of 2021.

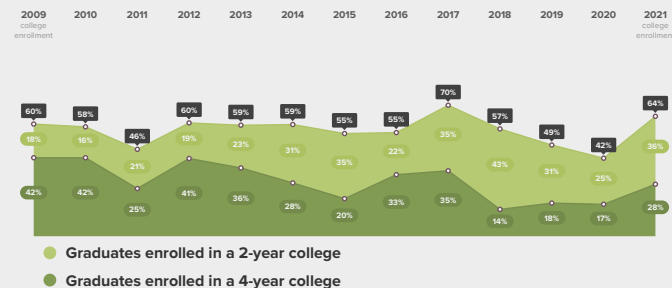
7% of 2021 high school graduates from Social Justice enrolled in college in fall of 2021.

19% of 2019 high school graduates from Social Justice who enrolled in college in fall of 2019 were continuously enrolled through spring of 2021.

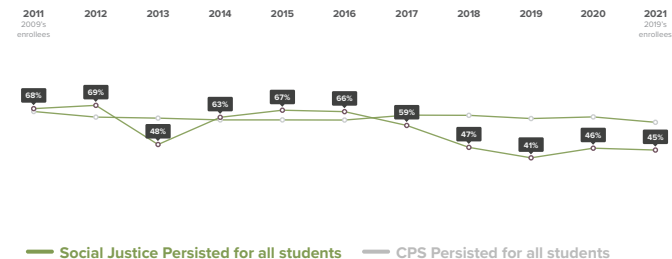
Where are 2019 Social Justice graduates after 4 semesters?

2-year enrollees 2019 Immediate Enrollees from Social Justice
 0% transferred to a 4-year college
19% remained in a 2-year college
81% did not persist

4-year enrollees 2019 Immediate Enrollees from Social Justice
 92% transferred to a 2-year college
0% transferred to a 2-year college
8% did not persist

An additional 0% of Social Justice's 2019 high school graduates who immediately enrolled in 2-year college transferred to a 4-year college at semester 5.

34% of 2015 high school graduates from Social Justice who immediately enrolled in college completed a degree or credential by spring of 2021.
